
Because of grounds and for the reasons heretofore stated in the Petition of the Idaho Fish and Game Department for leave to participate as Amicus Curiae in this proceeding, this Amicus Curiae has been and is vitally concerned with the impact of Indian fishing, both commercial and noncommercial, on the anadromous fishery resources of the States of Washington, Oregon and Idaho; and the determination reached by this Court in this matter will effect the anadromous fishery resources of the State of Idaho and the right of that State to impose reasonable and necessary conservation regulations upon treaty Indians fishing off their reservations at usual and accustomed grounds and stations and elsewhere.

Wherefore, the State of Idaho Fish and Game Department, as amicus curiae, respectfully urges that this Honorable Court grant the Defendant, Washington Department of Game's Motion for Summary Judgment and in so granting the same follow and apply the rationale of the United States Supreme Court in Ward v. Racehorse, 163 U. S. 504 (1896); U. S. v. Winans, 198 U. S. 371 (1905); Tulee v. Washington, 315 U. S. 681 (1942); Kennedy v. Becker, 241 U. S. 556 (1916); Village of Kake v. Egan, 396 U. S. 60 (1962); and Puyallup Tribe v. Department of Game, 391 U. S. 392 (1968), which firmly establish that a State may regulate off-reservation hunting and fishing activities of treaty Indians "in common with" and on an equal, nondiscriminatory basis with all other non-Indian citizens.

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

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
