The correspondent of the Seattle Budget speaking of the constitutional convention says: The convention has already developed a number of orators. Indeed there are hardly half a dozen members who have not had something to say about anything or even nothing.

A dispatch from Ellensburg of July 15th says men were engaged this afternoon shooting down standing brick walls through burned districts, which have been menacing the safety of workmen and pedestrians.

The last case of ice cream poisoning was at a Canada picnic last week, when 200 persons were made very sick by eating cream that was kept several days in the freezers.

A Seattle delegation has appeared before the constitutional convention, to oppose the stringent limit which it is said will be placed upon municipal indebtedness, now proposed at 3 per cent of the assessment of any city.

Outside of the convention there is first of all the lobby, whose most conspicuous figure is Dennison, the champion of woman suffrage, who dresses in the costume of Henry Clay's time with a high collar and black cravat.

The Japan Gazette of the 29th ult., contains the following: Intelligence has been received at Hong Kong from Kiayang Chan, a prefecture in the northwest of Kwang Lung, that early in the morning of the 2d inst., the Chang Ping and Ping Yun districts were flooded by the bursting of a water spout or tornado, described by the Chinese as a water dragon.
