NON-CRIMINAL CASES

1. Forty-five (45) days following any one of the conditions below occurring in this case:
 - A. The judgment of acquittal is filed; *or*
 - B. The final judgment is filed; *or*
 - C. The judgment, decree, or order becomes final after appeal; *or*
 - D. A dismissal is filed

Each attorney, plaintiff/petitioner, or a representative designated in writing may withdraw the exhibits s/he has provided to the Clerk.


2. Exhibits not withdrawn within 90 days following case completion as defined above will be destroyed without further notice to any of the attorneys or parties in this case and without further order of the Court.
3. Per RCW 36.18.016(10), each party providing exhibits in this case will be charged a \$20.00 disposal fee for exhibits not withdrawn within 90 days following case completion. This fee is subject to collection.

CRIMINAL CASES

1. One year following any one of the conditions below occurring in this case:
 - A. The judgment of acquittal is filed; *or*
 - B. The final judgment is filed; *or*
 - C. The judgment, decree, or order becomes final after appeal; *or*
 - D. A dismissal is filed

Each attorney, plaintiff/petitioner, or a representative designated in writing may withdraw the exhibits s/he has provided to the Clerk.

2. Exhibits not withdrawn following case completion as defined above will be destroyed without further order of the Court.




