COME NOW all plaintiffs, herein, by Stuart F. Pierson, plaintiffs' liaison counsel, acting on behalf of one or more of the plaintiffs herein, and pursuant to Rule 36 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure and paragraphs 10 and 16 of the Order of April 24, 1973, herewith propound the following requests for admissions with regard to the genuineness of certain documents, severally to the defendant State of Washington, the intervenor-defendants Thor Tollefson, Carl Crouse, the Washington State Game Commission and the Washington Reef Net Owners Association through defendants' liaison counsel.

#### PREFACE

It is the purpose of this set of requests for admissions to request the defendants to admit the genuineness of the documents. here referred to and described. Attached to this set of requests for admissions are the original certified copies of the documents taken by plaintiffs from the National Archives. Attached also is a set of copies of these documents for use by the defendants. Plaintiffs herewith request that, upon their examination of their copies and the certified copies of the documents herein referred to, the defendants return to the plaintiffs in Seattle (c/o Ms. Lee Flesher, United States Attorney's Office) the full set of certified copies.

- 73. Attached hereto marked USA-8a is an accurate certified copy of a one-page letter dated December 6, 1856 from Isaac I. Stevens (hereinafter "Stevens") to E. S. Fowler.
- 74. Attached hereto marked USA-8b is an accurate certified copy of a three-page letter dated December 16, 1856 from E. S. Fowler to Stevens.
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75. Attached hereto marked USA-9 is an accurate copy of a 35-page document (pages 8 through 42) consisting of the Report of Mr. George Gibbs, dated March 4, 1854, and published as Executive Document No. 91, House of Representatives for the Second Session of the 33rd Congress.

76. Attached hereto marked USA-10 is an accurate certified copy of a 12-page document consisting of portions of the Journal of James Doty, Secretary for Treaties in the Washington Territory, showing proceedings between January 20 and May 21, 1855, in assembling Indian people for councils in the Walla Walla Valley.

77. Attached hereto marked USA-11 is an accurate certified copy of a 22-page document consisting of an original copy of the Treaty of June 9 and 11, 1855 with the Yakima and Confederated Tribes in the Walla Walla Valley, a letter from Stevens to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs dated June 14, 1855 enclosing said Treaty and the official proceedings with the Yakima Nation, and a copy of the official proceedings.

78. Attached hereto marked USA-12 is an accurate certified copy of a 14-page document consisting of a partial record of proceedings of the Commission to hold treaties with the Indian Tribes in the Washington Territory and the Blackfoot country, during the period between December 7, 1854 and March 3, 1855.

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79. Attached hereto marked USA-13 is an accurate certified copy of a 14-page document consisting of another copy of the proceedings of the Commission to hold treaties with the Indian Tribes in the Washington Territory and the Blackfoot country between December 7, 1854 and January 3, 1855.

80. Attached hereto marked USA-14 is an accurate certified copy of a 12-page document consisting of a letter dated December 30, 1854 from Stevens to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs transmitting the Treaty of Medicine Creek and the proceedings of the Treaty Commission between December 7 and 26, 1854, and tracings of the Nisqually, Puyallup and Squawskin Reservations. The Nisqually Reservation is referred to as the Shenahnam Reservation; the Squawskin Reservation is referred to as the Klah-che-min Reservation; and the Puyallup Reservation is referred to as the Choche-oot-luts Reservation. The reservations thus traced by Stevens are his proposals and not necessarily the boundaries of the reservations as later established.

81. Attached hereto marked USA-15 is an accurate certified copy of a seven-page document consisting of a partial record of the proceedings on January 22, 1855 wherein the Treaty of Point Elliott was negotiated and executed.

82. Attached hereto marked USA-16 is an accurate certified copy of a five-page document consisting of a draft of the Treaty of Point Elliott drafted by the United States Treaty Commission.

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83. Attached hereto marked USA-17 is an accurate certified copy of a 14-page document consisting of a letter dated May 4, 1855 from Stevens to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs transmitting a record of the proceedings of the Treaty of Point Elliott Treaty Commission, between January 5 and 23, 1855, and transmitting the Treaties of Point No Point and Neah Bay, negotiated and executed respectively on January 26 and 31, 1855. Included also in this document is a record of the proceedings of negotiation and execution of the Treaty of Point No Point, January 26, 1855.

84. Attached hereto marked USA-18 is an accurate certified copy of a seven-page document consisting of a record of council and negotiation proceedings prior to and including execution of the Treaty of Neah Bay, January 29-31, 1855.

85. Attached hereto marked USA-19 is an accurate certified copy of a two-page document consisting of a rough draft of the Treaty of Neah Bay drafted by the United States Treaty Commissioners.

86. Attached hereto marked as USA-20 is an accurate certified copy of a nine-page document consisting of a record of the council proceedings, wherein the Treaty of Point No Point was negotiated and executed during January 24-26, 1855.

87. Attached hereto marked as USA-21 is an accurate certified copy of a six-page document consisting of a letter dated December 21, 1854 and a letter dated January 6, 1855 from George Gibbs, surveyor under the Treaty of Medicine Creek to Stevens, reporting the survey of the proposed Puyallup Reservation.

88. Attached hereto marked USA-22 is an accurate certified copy of a four-page document consisting of a letter dated February 14, 1855 from Commissioner of Indian Affairs to the Office of Indian Affairs reporting on the Treaty of Medicine Creek.

- 89. Attached hereto marked USA-23 is an accurate certified copy of a four-page document consisting of an accurate copy of a letter dated August 28, 1856 from Stevens to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs recommending a change in the reservations initially proposed for the Nisqually and Puyallup Indians.
- 90. Attached hereto marked USA-24 is an accurate certified copy of a seven-page document consisting of a report dated November 29, 1856 by a board appointed by Stevens to formulate a plan for carrying into effect the Treaty of Medicine Creek. This report followed upon a visit to the four reservations provided by that treaty, in accordance with instructions issued on November 15, 1856.

Attached hereto marked USA-25 is an accurate certified copy of a letter dated May 22, 1856 from Stevens to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs enclosing "Journal of Operations of Governor Stevens, Superintendent Indian Affairs and Commissioner treating with Indian Tribes East of the Cascade Mountains in Washington Territory and the Blackfeet and neighboring Tribes near the Great Falls of the Mifsourie in the Year 1855", which journal covers the period between January 20, 1855 and January 4, 1856.

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92. Attached hereto marked USA-26 is an accurate certified copy of a 12-page document consisting of another copy of the document described in paragraph 76 above with respect to USA-10.

- 93. Attached hereto marked USA-27 is an accurate certified copy of a 93-page document consisting of the certified record of the official proceedings at the council in the Walla Walla Valley, the negotiation and execution of the Treaty with the Yakima at a council between June 9-11, 1855, which record covers the period between May 22 and June 11, 1855.
- 94. Attached hereto marked USA-28 is an accurate copy of a four-page document consisting of a letter dated August 30, 1854 from Charles E. Mix, Acting Commissioner of Indian Affairs to Stevens.
- 95. Attached hereto marked USA-29 is an accurate copy of a six-page document consisting of an accurately typed version of the Treaty with the Yakimas, June 9, 1855, 12 Stat. 951.
- 96. Attached hereto marked USA-30 is an accurate copy of a 75-page document (including pages 80 through 154) consisting of an accurately typed copy of the record of proceedings at the council in the Walla Wallay, June 9-11, 1855.

- 100. Attached hereto marked USA-34 is an accurate copy of a 33-page document consisting of a study by the Washington State Extension Service in connection with mitigation funds relating to the Dalles Dam.

USA-35'is an accurate copy of a document consisting of a letter dated July 22, 1942 from the Superintendent for Indian Affairs to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, relating to the reliance of the Yakima Tribe on fish.
