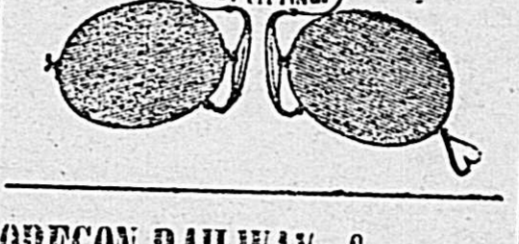

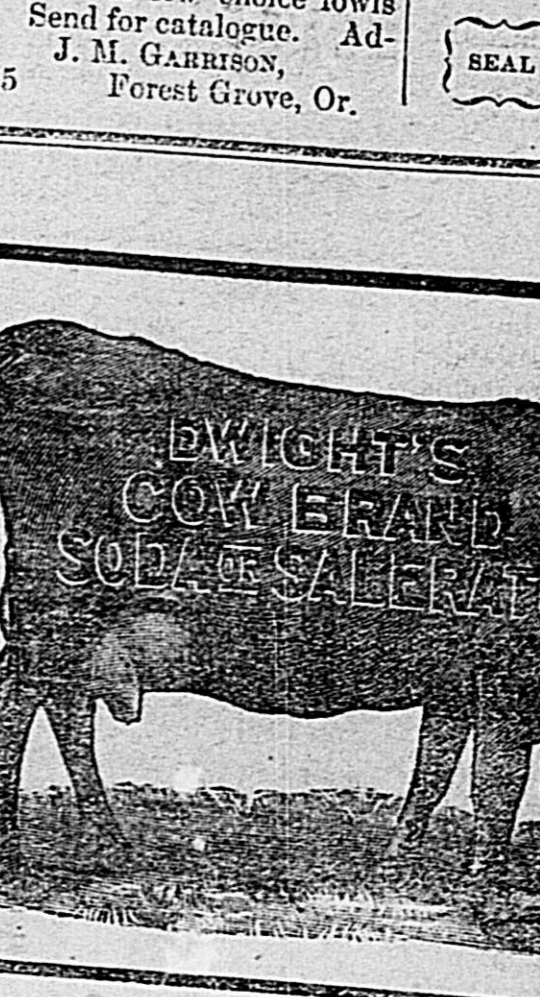

**PROCLAMATION.**

WHEREAS, Under the act of congress, approved February 22, 1889, to enable the people of Washington to form a constitution and state government, provision is made for submitting said constitution to the people for ratification or rejection, at an election to be held on the first Tuesday in October, and

WHEREAS, Provision is also made in said act for the election of officers for full state government, including members of the legislature and a representative in the fifty-first congress:  
Now, THEREFORE, I, MILES C. MOORE, governor of the said territory, by virtue of the authority in me vested by law, do hereby declare that a general election will be held throughout said Territory of Washington, on Tuesday, October 1, 1890, for the ratification or rejection of the constitution and for the election of the following officers:  
1 Representative to the fifty-first congress of the United States.  
1 Governor.  
1 Lieutenant Governor.  
1 Secretary of State.  
1 State Treasurer.  
1 State Auditor.  
1 Attorney General.  
1 Superintendent of Public Instruction.  
1 Commissioner of Public Lands.  
5 Supreme Court Judges.  
12 Superior Court Judges.  
70 Members of the State House of Representatives.  
35 Members of the State Senate.  
1 County Clerk for each county.  
The electors will also vote at said election:  
For or against the Constitution of the State of Washington.  
For or against separate Article No. 1.  
For or against separate Article No. 2.

For the permanent location of the Seat of Government as provided in Section 18 of the schedule of said Constitution.  
The said election shall be conducted, the returns made, the result ascertained and the certificates to persons elected issued in the manner prescribed by the laws of this territory regulating elections therein, and the vote cast for the adoption of the constitution, and the several separate articles and the location of the State Capital, shall be returned to the Secretary of the territory in the manner provided in the enabling act.  
IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I hereunto set my hand and cause the Great Seal of the said territory to be affixed.  
Done in the City of Olympia this 27th day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and fourteenth.
